


Read Non-Fiction and Roll

Read a non-fiction book and answer the questions. Roll a die and complete the activity book you read.


•	Write a heading from the book you read.

READING RESPONSE ACTIVITIES

List the main events in the story.	Drawand describe the main characters.	Retell the favourite part of the story.	
List all the characters in the story.	Draw all the characters in the story.	Make a word web for one of the characters	
Retell the beginning middle and end of the story in your own words.	List 4 questions you would ask the main character.	Make a detailed drawing of the ending	
Paint the main characters.	Draw the main character and label it with particular feelings they may have felt.	Complete an author study.	
Design a rating system like a 5 star grading. Ask the class to give their score.	Make a rhyming poem about the story.	Write a letter to the author detailing what you thought of their book.	
Design a different cover for the book.	Read and act out your favourite part of the story.	Write a book report.

Make an advertisement to sell the book.		Give an oral reading of your favourite part of the story.	
Write 5 comprehension questions for your classmates to answer.	Design a board game using the characters and events from the story.
