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## Red Class

Red Class are enjoying the journey towards Year 1 as we are learning more complex skills in our subjects.

We are focusing on capital letters, full stops and using the word 'and' to join our sentence ideas, in English.

In Maths, we are exploring counting in steps of 2's and 10's as well as space, shape and measure activities. We are thinking about how to reason about shapes, time, seasons, length, height and capacity.

Our new summer topics are a great opportunity to get to grips with more investigations and hands on experiments as well as consolidating this year's learning.







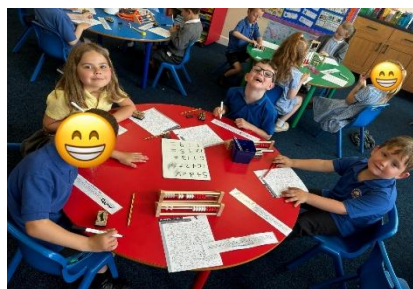
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## Orange Class

Summer Term is certainly flying by in Orange Class! We have been busy in English learning about our text called 'A Midsummer Night's Dream.' The children are doing a fantastic job of applying key features into our writing such as suffixes, adjectives, verbs and a range of punctuation. In maths, we have been mastering addition and subtraction beyond 20 and we have now moved onto 2D and 3D shapes.

We have also been learning about holidays in science and the children are enjoying sharing their experiences and linking this to how we can stay safe in different temperatures.

Finally, in our RE lessons the children have been digging deeper into the 'Good Samaritan' story and how we can demonstrate those qualities within our daily lives by being kind and respectful to all in our community and wider.



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## Yellow Class

WOW, what a busy Summer Term we are having! Yellow Class started this half term completing their end of Key Stage 1 assessments. They all worked so hard, displaying great determination and perseverance. Well done to you all! In our English, the children have really enjoyed our text, 'The Secret Giant' and have really impressed me with their application of the skills taught this year to produce some wonderful pieces of descriptive writing. The children are also really enjoying our whole school themed text, 'The Bear and The Piano' and have enjoyed writing postcards from the perspective of the bear.

In Science, we have planted some runner beans, sunflowers and carrots and we are enjoying observing these and checking their progress daily.

The children have made some fantastic predictions about the story and have created some fantastic setting descriptions. They are in the process of creating persuasive posters, showcasing their creativity and persuasive writing abilities. It's been wonderful to see their imaginations come to life through their writing!

Wow! Hasn't Summer 2 term been a busy one so far! During English lessons, all children have produced amazing non-fiction leaflets about Coral Reefs.
